

Hill AFB Child Care & Preschool Options

For On Base Care

Go to <http://www.75thforcesupport.com/>

Click menu, then you can choose from these on base care programs:

Child Development Center (CDC): 801-777-6321/6223. For birth -5 years (if not in kinder yet.)
Under Menu search Child Development Center, scroll down to Enrollment Information & Forms

Youth Programs: 801-777-2419- For child care look for School Age Programs or Recreation. Look for Open Rec. Under Menu search Youth Programs, scroll to see what is available.

Family Child Care (FCC): 801-777-0695 - FCC licensed/affiliated providers are made up of providers that operate independent businesses. Hourly and part-time care is available by contacting the providers directly. Rates will vary. Providers are held to high standards, call for details of training and compliance. Anyone living on base that watches children for more than 10 hours per week (example: 3 kids X 4 hours each = 12 hours even when concurrent) from their home is required to be an FCC licensed/affiliated provider. We recommend that you DO NOT set up recurring or fulltime care with anyone living on base that is not an FCC licensed/affiliated provider as you risk your care being cut off and the caregiver can lose his/her base housing privileges.

For Off Base Care

Go to this site and click "Families" to look for resources such as child care, fee assistance, preschool or other activities. Here are your choices of how to use this program:

1. Visit or call the agency for a one-on-one consultation. 801-626-7837. The referral specialists will collect the information needed to create your personalized list. I recommend this for families that have children with special needs, so you can be certain they understand your criteria.
2. Submit your information via the referral request form (found on site.) The referral specialists will use the information you provide to supply a customized list of child care providers.
3. Search this database directly from this website: <http://careaboutchildcare.utah.gov/>. This website the profiles of child care providers located throughout Utah. All of these caregivers are state licensed. If you don't find a provider that meets your needs try the first step listed above.

They also give information about the specific caregiver including whether they have a background check on file.

Other Options

Hill AFB Babysitters Group 2.0 UPDATED AND SECURED is a closed Facebook page that you request to join. Parents post for a date night or for a last-minute appointment and people offer to care for their kids. Care may be in their home or your home, teenagers, adults, moms, dads, grandparents and more. Some request pay or trade services, others just want to get to know people who have kids with similar ages. Members live in many areas both on and around the base, which may help you find someone who resides near you. Be sure you feel comfortable with anyone you plan to leave your child with. These providers may not be licensed and/or background checked. Remember if you are trying to book someone living on base for recurring or fulltime care they will need to be an FCC licensed/affiliated provider through the base.

Funded Programs – See A&FRC for these programs

AF EFMP Respite Care Program offers families with children on EFMP, that meet eligibility, 40 hours of respite per month for the child with special needs AND their siblings! Respite time can be used to take a nap, go shopping, or have dinner with your spouse or however you choose to relax. For information on eligibility and enrollment process contact the EFMP-FS at A&FRC 801-586-2611 or 4820 or Family Child Care (FCC) at 801-777-0695. **Eligibility:** AF active duty; AF Reserve/Air Guard on Title 10 or 32 orders for 30 days or more; EFMP enrolled; need will be assessed

Give Parents a Break (GPAB) is funded by the Air Force Aid Society and applies if the military member is deployed, on an extended TDY, a remote tour of duty or an EFMP family (check with EFMP-FS for that process.) GPAB applies during family crises or emergency situations such as serious illnesses of immediate family members, deaths, extended illnesses of family members, births, and/or if a family has a child with special needs that can be supported by CDC/YP or in unique circumstances or hardships.

PCS Child Care is intended to help relieve stress felt by Air Force families in the process of a PCS and/or retirement move. AFAS will pay up to 20 hours of child care (per child) in FCC licensed/affiliated homes. Child care is based on availability of certified or affiliated FCC providers.

Volunteer Child Care is meant to enhance and expand participation in the installation volunteer program by ensuring the availability and accessibility of child care for volunteers' children.

Deployment/Remote Child Care Support allows families 16 hours for pre-deployment, 16 hours for each month of deployment and 16 hours post deployment. Program can be used once member has orders. Must be deployed a minimum of 30 days in support of a contingency operation. For remote tours 16 hours for each month of the remote assignment.
